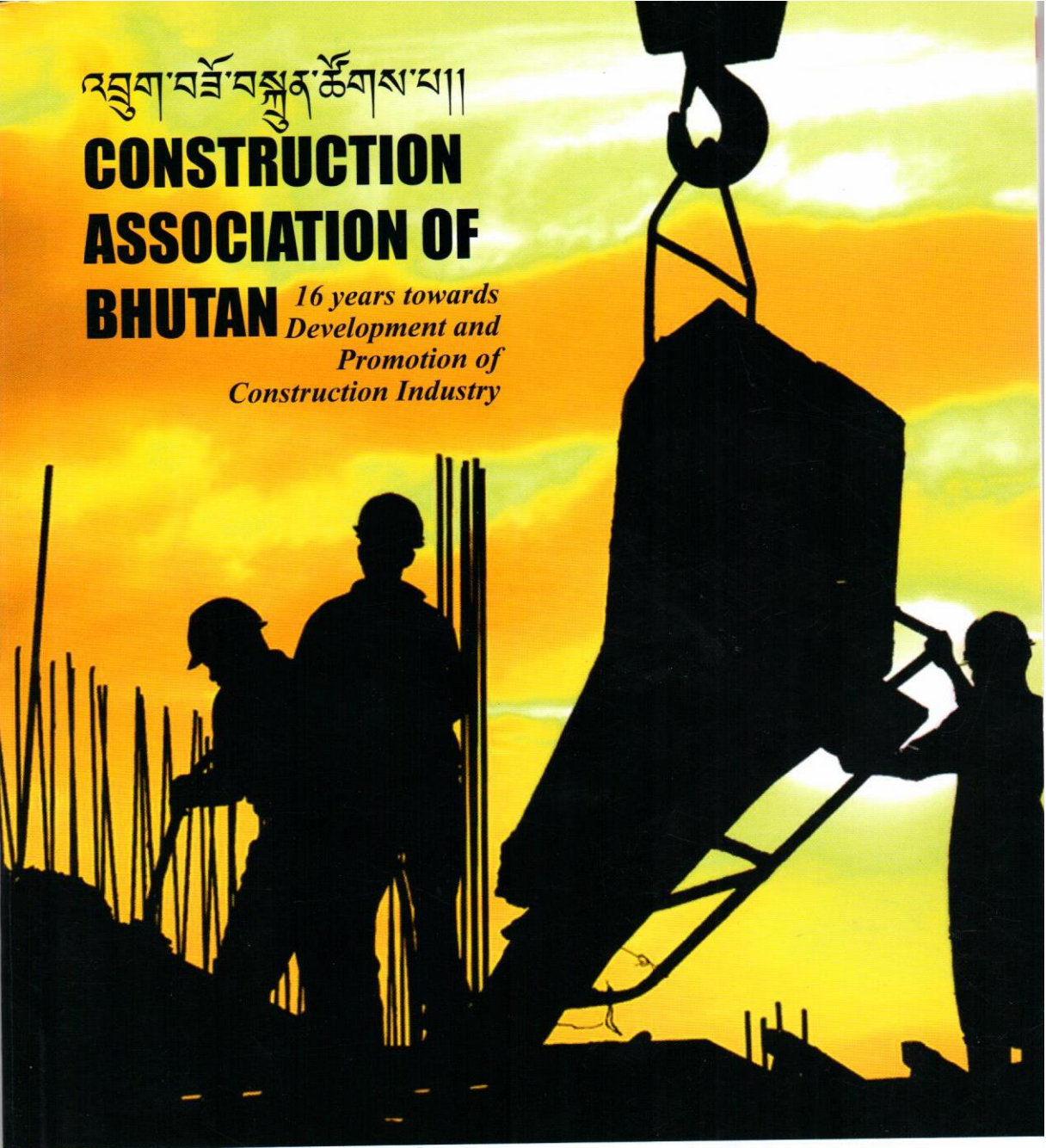

Green Public Procurement

The Green Public Procurement Bhutan (GPP) Project aims to establish a strategic approach to scaling-up demand for environmentally and socially preferable goods, services and infrastructure in Bhutan. It seeks to promote value-for-money across the asset life cycle rather than simply at the point of purchase, in order to reduce the negative environmental impacts and maximize social benefits from procurement.

- ✓ This means that the government has a huge power in driving markets towards more sustainable production and consumption patterns by asking for more sustainable goods, services and infrastructure.
- ✓ Construction contractors have the corresponding responsibility to suggest environmentally and socially preferable goods, services and public work projects if they want to bid for government tenders. The Public Procurement Rules (PRR) and the Standard Bidding Document (SBD) allows the bidders to propose suggestions.

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
